Introduction of Ms. Jennifer Christensen

President Dastmozd welcomed Ms. Jennifer Christensen to her first President's Advisory Council meeting. He explained that Ms. Christensen was replacing former Council member, Mr. Bernie Hesse. Ms. Christensen is President of UFCW Local 1189.

One Stop Update – Ms. Ali Pickens-Opoku, One Stop Director

Ms. Ali Pickens-Opoku gave a brief overview of the One Stop and how they are helping students from the moment they first step on campus to the day they graduate. Ms. Pickens-Opoku explained that the One Stop opened its doors on December 27, 2017 and has been busy ever since. The goal of One Stop is to provide everything a student needs to be successful here at the College. She explained that her staff provide help with everything from FAFSA to Career Coaching and everything in between. She shared that One Stop offers a such wide variety of services, it eliminates the need to shuffle students from department to department looking for answers. Currently the One-Stop is open from 9:00-7:00pm Monday through Friday and 9:30-5:00pm on Saturday.

Legislative Ask – Joint Letter of Support

President Dastmozd shared a draft of the support letter with the group. He explained that the letter from the Friends of Saint Paul College Foundation and the President's Advisory Council would be mailed to local Legislators to show support for the College's capital bonding and Higher Education Asset Preservation Replacement (HEAPR) requests. Earlier this week the FOSPC voted unanimously to support the letter. President Dastmozd asked if there were any objections to the letter. The group decided to unanimously support the letter.

Dr. King shared that registration for fall enrollment is now open for current students and then new students will be able to register starting on April 2. She also explained that she is in the middle of hiring a Director of Advising and a Director of Student Life. Lastly, Dr. King shared that graduation is set for May 17 and the planning process is well under way.

Academic Affairs Update

Dr. Raney explained that using data from IR, she is currently working with the faculty to help review and assess the health and outcomes of their program and set new goals for the upcoming semesters. She also shared that she is getting ready to hold on-campus finalist interviews for the various Dean positions that are open. She is hopeful to have the interviews completed by mid-April.

Marketing/Communication Update

President Dastmozd shared that the new marketing campaigns visible around town on the Green and Blue Line starting early spring. He also mentioned that there are many recruitment events scheduled for Spring including express registration and the open house on April 11th.

Institutional Research/ Planning and Grants Update

Ms. Sorenson explained that the IR department is working closely with faculty on completing data requests for various programs and departments. She also noted that Ms. Jennifer Rohde had recently joined the IR team as the Director of Resource Development.

Foundation Update

President Dastmozd reminded everyone that the 2018 Annual Scholarship Gala has been scheduled for Thursday, December 6. A save the date will be email and mailed out some time early summer along with

information on how to become a sponsor. He explained that the money from the Gala goes directly to scholarships and that the 2017 Gala raised just over \$300,000 for future students. President Dastmozd also shared that this year's Gala will feature the Wall of Fame recipients (Alumni of the Year and Community Partner of the Year) during the program. He encouraged everyone to share nominations for either award with Mr. David Kline or Ms. Margaret Soukup.

HR Update

Ms. Schmidt shared that so far this year her team has filled 42 positions on campus with an average of a 45-day fill rate. Currently, there are 16 open faculties, staff, and administration positions.
