

#### STUDENT RIGHTS & RESPONSIBILITIES

Saint Paul College recognizes your rights as a student are to be respected. Your rights and responsibilities as outlined in Minnesota State Colleges & Universities system Board Policy 3.1 include the following:

#### Part 1: Freedom to Learn

In addition to the basic constitutional rights enjoyed by all citizens, students at the College have specific rights related to academic freedom and their status as students. Freedom to teach and freedom to learn are inseparable facets of academic freedom. The freedom to learn depends upon appropriate opportunities and conditions in the classroom, on the campus, and in the larger community. Students are expected to exercise their freedom with responsibility.

#### Part 2: Freedom of Expression

Individual students and student organizations shall be free to examine and to discuss all questions of interest to them and to express opinions publicly and privately. They shall be free to support causes by orderly means that do not substantially disrupt the regular and essential operation of the institution. Students shall be free to take reasoned exception to the data or views offered in any course of study and to reserve judgment about matters of opinion, but they are responsible for learning the content of any course of study for which they are enrolled.

#### Part 3: Freedom of Association

Students shall be free to organize and join organizations to promote their common and lawful interests, subject to institutional policies or regulations. Registration or recognition may be withheld or withdrawn from organizations that violate institutional regulations.

#### Part 4: Student-Sponsored Forums

Students shall have the right to assemble, to select speakers, and to discuss issues of their choice. The college shall establish reasonable time, place and manner restrictions to assure that the assembly does not substantially disrupt the work of the institution or does not interfere with the opportunity of other students to obtain an education or otherwise infringe upon the rights of others. Such regulations shall not be used as a means of censorship. The president or designee may prohibit any forum when there is a likelihood of harm to individuals or damage to property if the event is held. Prior to any such prohibition, the president shall make a best effort to consult with the student association.

#### Part 5: Student Publications

Student-funded publications shall be free of censorship and advance approval of copy, and their editors and managers shall be free to develop their own editorial and news coverage policies. Editors and managers of student publications shall be protected from arbitrary suspension and removal because of student, faculty, administrative, or public disapproval of editorial policy or content. The student fee allocation process shall not be used as a means of editorial control of student-funded publications. All student publications shall explicitly state on the editorial page that the opinions therein expressed are not necessarily those of the college, system, or student body.

#### STUDENT RIGHTS & RESPONSIBILITIES

#### **Part 6: Student Policies**

The policies of the College regarding student expectations, rights and responsibilities shall be readily accessible to students.

#### Part 7: Catalog & Course Information

To the extent possible, students shall be provided relevant and accurate information regarding courses prior to enrollment. Catalog descriptions and website postings shall be accurate and based on information existing at the time of publication. To the extent possible, class schedules shall list the names of faculty teaching courses.

#### Part 8: Student Academic Standing Information

Students shall have access to accurate information for establishing and maintaining acceptable academic standing, information which will enable students to determine their individual academic standing, and information regarding graduation requirements.

#### Part 9: Academic Evaluation

Student academic performance shall be evaluated solely on the basis of academic standards, including any requirements that are noted in the catalog, course syllabus, or student handbook. Students shall have protection against prejudiced or capricious evaluation and shall not be evaluated on the basis of opinions or conduct in matters unrelated to academic standards. Students shall have the right to review their corrected examinations or other required assignments used by the faculty in evaluating the student's academic performance.

#### Part 10: Property Rights

Term papers, essays, projects, works of art, and similar property, including property in which the student has intellectual property rights pursuant to Board Policy 3.26, shall be returned to a student upon request, within a reasonable timeframe, when no longer needed for evaluation purposes, unless the student grants written permission for them to be retained.

#### Part 11: Student Review & Consultation

Students shall have the right to appropriate levels of participation in college decision-making pursuant to Policy 2.3 and Procedure 2.3.1, Student Involvement in decision-making. The College President shall recognize the Student Senate as the official representative of the students. The Student Senate shall have the right to recommend the chartering of clubs and organizations for approval by the College President. Students shall be given the opportunity to serve as members of College committees, including the following: President's Advisory Council, Technology Committee, Finance Committee, Facilities Committee and Marketing Committee. Exceptions to participation may include committees established for the evaluation of personnel, committees established under collective bargaining agreements and management teams, presidential cabinets and committees of the board. The College President shall meet with the Student Senate at least twice per semester to discuss issues of mutual concern. The College President will structure the consultation process to provide adequate time for students to be able to discuss and consider an issue prior to any proposed recommendation.

- Course options to plan your registration
- Transfer of credits and courses and how they apply toward
- Minnesota Transfer Credit (MnTC) completion
- Approved Academic Petitions/Exceptions

#### Tips for reading your DARS report

The DARS report lists your program of study and the year you started that program.

If the information is inaccurate, please contact Advising as soon as possible.

Transfer credits are listed on your DARS report with a "T" preceding the grade to indicate "transfer."

Developmental credits (those numbered below 1000) are used to calculate your GPA, but do not count toward completion of your degree; they are listed at the end of the audit report.

#### **POLICIES AND PROCEDURES**

Saint Paul College strives to create a safe and inclusive learning environment for all students, staff, and faculty. We all have a role in creating a positive college experience for ourselves and others.

#### ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

Saint Paul College values truth and honesty in academics. As a Saint Paul College student, you are expected to reflect these values in your work. Students submitting work that is not their own is considered an academic integrity violation. Here are some examples of the kinds of actions that violate academic integrity:

- Copying others' work during an exam, assignment, paper, or other assessment, or using others' work without properly citing/giving credit to the source
- Using unauthorized notes or aids during an examination
- Taking an exam or test for another student or having someone take your exam for you
- Collaborating with any other person during a test without permission
- Using or giving unauthorized assistance on a take-home exam, assigned physical work, projects, or any other academic work
- Attempting to obtain an unreleased test or information about an unreleased test
- Submitting the same work for credit in more than one course (even if retaking a course) without consulting the instructors

#### **POLICIES AND PROCEDURES**

- Submitting research and assignments prepared by others (e.g., purchasing the services of a commercial semester paper company, using documents found online via uploading/sharing sites, getting help from online forums or question/answer sites, etc.)
- Submitting work, papers, or research generated by artificial intelligence programs, or using such programs for exams or other assessments without permission

The College wants to make especially clear that the use of any artificial intelligence (AI) programs without the consent or permission of your instructor is a violation of policy. Such programs may include ChatGPT, but also tools like QuillBot (a paraphrasing tool artificial intelligence tool), Wordtune, and tools that generate photos, mathematical equations, etc. Works submitted should be yours alone unless cited or permitted otherwise.

#### **RECREATIONAL MARIJUANA**

This section is intended to clarify how the new law might come in contact with the policies at Saint Paul College (and other MinnState Colleges and Universities).

Who is allowed to possess marijuana under the new law? Adults 21 and older may possess up to two pounds of cannabis at home, and two ounces while in public.

Is marijuana legal to possess/use/sell at Saint Paul College? No. Because of the Federal Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act, and because marijuana is still considered a controlled substance under federal law, marijuana is not allowed on campus (or any off-campus academic sites, like a job or clinical site) under any circumstances.

Will Saint Paul College's policies around drugs/marijuana change? The College's policies around drugs/marijuana will not change at this time. Along with banning the possession/use/selling of marijuana, being under the influence of marijuana while on campus (or any off campus academic sites, like a job or clinical site) is a violation of policy.

#### ASSESSMENT

Assessment of basic skills in math, reading and writing is required if you are seeking a degree, diploma or certificate in a major program. This requirement may be waived if you've previously completed college level

English or math with a minimum grade of "C". Some programs also require completion of additional Assessments. Assessments are available on a walk-in basis. No appointment is necessary. It takes approximately 2½ hours to complete these un-timed assessments. Assessments are not available during holidays and when the College is closed. 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## **SCHOLARSHIPS**

The Friends of Saint Paul College Foundation raises money for scholarships for Saint Paul College students for the fall, spring, and summer terms. Each year the Foundation awards about \$300,000 in scholarships to more than 300 students. Unlike a student loan, a scholarship is a gift that is not paid back.

### Scholarship Application Dates

2025 Spring Semester application opens Wednesday, September 25, 2024. Application closes Friday, October 25, 2024.

2025 Summer Semester application opens Monday, February 3, 2025. Application closes Friday, February 28, 2025.

2025 Fall Semester application opens Wednesday, April 2, 2025. Application closes Friday, May 9, 2025.

Our online scholarship application makes it easy for you to apply. Gathering needed information for the application may take some time, so don't wait until the application deadline to apply. No extensions are possible. Please keep in mind the following:

- Complete one application and the online scholarship software program automatically matches you with different scholarships.
- Tell us about you: You will need to write an autobiography about your background, your goals, and why you're applying for a scholarship. Writing support is available through our Academic Support Center (Tutoring Services) and setting up an appointment with General Reading/Writing Support. Minimally have someone else read your biography to check for content and grammar.
- Current students must have a reference from a Saint Paul College employee. We suggest you give them at least a week to complete the reference. The employee completes the reference section of the application and can upload an optional recommendation letter. Request a reference as soon as possible on the application.
- New students must upload a previous transcript: New students without completed credits at Saint Paul College will need to upload a transcript from a previous school. The transcript should show the classes you have taken and your grades.

Not every student who applies receives a scholarship. There are more students who apply than dollars available and the selection of scholarship recipients is competitive. Regardless, we encourage all students to apply each semester for scholarships.

You are notified before the start of a term if you will receive a scholarship. Your scholarship dollars are sent to the Tuition office and applied towards your tuition and fees. Scholarship dollars disburse after the add/drop date for the semester.

# BEING AN UPSTANDER IN RISKY SITUATIONS











You can help stop relationship or sexual violence or stalking. When something is not right it is essential for members of the community to intervene. Risky situations and harassment can escalate quickly so it is helpful to plan some strategies. If you have a plan, you will know what to do when something happens.

### Identifying Risky Situations

We know that it can be hard to know how and when to intervene. It might feel awkward or strange to intervene but being prepared will help you take action when the time comes.

#### How can I tell someone needs me to intervene?

- They look like they are uncomfortable or are shifting positions,
- They are ignoring the other person but the other person is not going away,
- They have already said "no" or tried to end the conversation,
- They are trying to move away but their path is blocked,
- They are asleep, passed out, or too intoxicated to care for themselves,
- You feel like the situation is not okay trust your instincts!
- What else can you think of?

### **Options for intervening**

The best option is the one that works for you. Here are some ideas:

- Direct Talk directly to the person causing harm so they know their actions are not okay.
- Distract Interrupt harmful actions or words before they escalate by causing a distraction.
- Delegate Gather resources and support people or authorities to address the situation
- Delay Check-in with the victim afterward because sometimes waiting is safest.
- Document Record the situation so there is evidence of what happened. Always
  ask the victim what they want to do with the footage and never post it online or
  use it without their permission.
